



Shipping vinyl binders during freezing temperatures may result in “cold cracking”. Cold cracking occurs when vinyl materials are subjected to very low temperatures, and does not represent a defect in the binders.

Cold cracking is most common with orders sent via individual boxes (UPS, FedEx, etc), but can also happen with larger orders sent via LTL freight. Many freight companies will not pick up product that is labeled “protect from freezing”. Because of this we require explicit customer authorization before we will ship vinyl products when temperatures are forecast to be below 10 to 20 degrees for an extended period of time.
